





Tips for minimalist a interior

- * MAKE ENOUGH ROOM around a product and allow it to breathe.
- * BIG NO-NO TO clutter, allow for plenty of open space.
- * GREYS AND WHITES FORM THE dominant colour palette.
- * BUILD A SILHOUETTE WITH thin lines and functional elements.
